The Border Terrier fought out a well earned away win at The Blue Bell this week and the difference was taking all three doubles as the threes and singles were shared equally. Charlie Robson was again a stand out for the home side and Gavin Hosie continuing his good form with another ton plus finish on 108.

Tynemouth Club bounced straight back from last weeks draw to take a double point win on the road to the Fat Ox. Rob Doherty carded some good ton plus scores but visitors took a clean sweep in the singles. Peter Russell taking out a cracking 137 and John Ashcroft also stood out with a 17 dart leg including a 2d finish on 87. Good to see him getting back to the player he can be after a long spell suffering from a shoulder injury.

Marden Club won out in their match with The Red Lion and the visitors did well coming back from 4-0 down as the Marden were all scoring consistently well. The two oldest men in the room and indeed the league (both are in their seventies) showed the rest how to do it. Mattie Richardson recording another two maximums, both of which were hit at crucial points to swing the momentum the home sides way and Ralph Cox taking out a 16 dart singles leg. A couple of class acts that a lot of guys would do well to emulate.

The Phoenix Tap B continue to prop up the other 13 sides and despite the fact they are well adrift at the bottom they still give it a go every week. A few new faces are signed on for them but the opposition was way to strong given the Lodge B lads are very steady performers and on the back of heavy ton plus scoring took the spoils with Chris Matthews hitting his fifth maximum of the season.

The Seahorse derby saw the predicted result with the B team way too strong for the A lads. Adam Weldon and Frank Barnett took the middle doubles point to save the whitewash but this result for the second week in succession halves the points gap between the top two and keeps last years champions right in the mix.

The Phoenix Tap A once again go very quietly about their impressive business with another good win away at Whitley Lodge B. Three all going into the singles they took five of the six which made all the difference and keeps them in 4th. The Lodge A stay close enough to The Fat Ox to keep it interesting in places ten and eleven.

The Victoria stay top with a cracking win at home to the improving Grey Horse. Another match sitting at 3-3 going into the singles but they claimed all six of the remaining points and that's not easy against the calibre of player the Horse have. Simon Malpass hitting a max and Arran Samuels a solid 17 dart leg but Ben Clarke also stood out with his ton plus scoring. The win keeps it all very interesting at the top and both they and the Seahorse B should take every credit for keeping the league this competitive thus far and we look forward to it continuing.
